

In addition to receiving general information about Jefferson College programs, attendees can visit with faculty and staff from a variety of programs and student support departments.

"Over the past 10 years, Jefferson College Arnold has provided a first class education to over 17,125 students who have taken at least one class at that site," said College President Dr. Raymond Cummiskey. "This celebration is the College's way of giving a heartfelt 'thank you' to our community, students, and employees for their support throughout the past decade."

The celebration will provide the opportunity for new and prospective students to learn about the College's numerous academic programs and



student support services, submit a free admission application, complete the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid), learn about A+ scholarship updates, and register for classes with an advisor.

Those who wish to enroll are required to bring a photo ID and show placement test scores (within the last two years) prior to the registration process. After registering, students will be able to pay fees and obtain a parking sticker in a convenient "one stop" setting.

Construction of the \$8 million, 40,000 square foot facility in 2007 was directly linked to recommendations from elected, civic, and educational leaders that reviewed higher education needs in northern Jefferson County. Among the building's many features are electronic "SMART" classrooms, fully equipped science classrooms/labs, computer classrooms, an Academic Support Center, Learning Center/Assessment Center, a lecture hall/community meeting room, Enrollment Services, bookstore, student lounge, and an administrative office for Missouri Baptist University.

In 2011, a \$1.2 million 6,000 square foot construction/remodeling project added three general purpose classrooms equipped with SMART technology, a computer classroom, a science lab, and additional faculty/administrative offices.

Jefferson College tuition costs are \$105 per credit hour for in-district residents plus a \$5 per credit hour technology fee. Some courses may have additional lab fees and some programs such as Practical Nursing and the Law Enforcement Academy have separate fee structures.

Quality Education - Paramedic Program Receives National Accreditation Through 2022

The Jefferson College Paramedic program has received five-year accreditation by the Commission on Accreditation of Allied Health Education programs, upon the recommendation of the Committee on Accreditation of Educational Programs for the Emergency Medical Services Professions (CoAEMSP) through 2022.

The program underwent a rigorous evaluation using nationally accepted standards of excellence in instruction, facilities, and equipment.

Led by Earl Neal, Jim Bringer and Diane Scanga, the Jefferson College Paramedic program is a popular public service training option, allowing students to pursue an Associate of Applied Science degree or a Career and Technical certificate. Graduates are employed at many EMT-Paramedic agencies and providers throughout the region.



The Commission on Accreditation of Allied Health Education Programs (CAAHEP) accredits educational programs that prepare health professionals in a variety of disciplinary areas. Accreditation is one step in a process that is meant to protect the public and ensure a supply of qualified health care professionals. Programs are accredited when it is determined that they meet the educational standards and guidelines established by the profession.

CAAHEP is the largest programmatic accreditor of the health sciences professions. In collaboration with its Committees on Accreditation, CAAHEP reviews and accredits over 2,100 individual education programs in 30 health science occupations.

The Paramedic level is the highest licensure level that an EMS provider can obtain. Jefferson College's Paramedic program teaches students to become proficient in providing life-saving skills and procedures, along with defensive

driving operations. Paramedic training contains the latest instruction in IV fluids procedures, advanced airway techniques, cardiology information, pharmacology instruction, surgical airways, and cardiac monitoring.

After successfully completing the program, students are eligible to take the National Registry Licensure Test and become a licensed Paramedic in the state of Missouri or work in most states with their National Registry License.

There is a separate application process for the Paramedic Program, which is part of a competitive admissions review. Applications for the fall 2018 class of the Paramedic Program will be available after March 2018. Review of applications will begin in April 2018. Both courses provided practical and theoretical information in order to improve service and operation.

The hands-on continuing education classes, held in the Jefferson College Area Technical School kitchen and classroom on the Hillsboro campus, included Kitchen Ranger Bootcamp and CEO of You. Over 50 individuals from throughout the region attended.

The second course, "CEO of You," was designed specifically for those in a leadership role or who are potential future leaders. Discussion topics included managing peers, championing brand and reputation, professional harassment training, conducting regular productive meetings with a team, and proper interviewing techniques and questions.

One Potato...Two Potato...Three Potato...Four: Unique Simulation Teaches Key Concepts to Nursing Students

tudents in the Jefferson College Nursing Program recently had some fun during a highly unique interactive learning simulation involving the popular Potato Head family of toys.

Taught by Assistant Nursing Professors Holly Boettcher, Barbara Haynes, and Sheryl Zysk, the simulation was a unique way to demonstrate quality improvement concepts, patient safety and medical errors, lean process management, and teamwork and communication.

In a scenario following a terrible bus crash involving members of the Potato Head family, EMS arrives at the scene to find body parts scattered all over the road and surrounding area. Luckily, a family member has a photo album with pictures of each person.

Students were divided into a series of ER trauma teams and their goal was to accurately assemble as many patients as possible in seven minutes. Based on input from photos and other team members, only two people from each team (implantation specialists) could physically implant the Potato Head body parts. The completed patients were then inspected for accuracy by someone outside their team.

The purpose of the simulation was to teach students the concept of lean process management created by the Toyota Production System in which efficiency and quality are equally important. Every step of the process adds value and eliminates waste. Each member of the team is valued for their contributions to the process and for their ideas for improving the system and insuring safety.

The teaching/learning simulation results started out with only a few Potato Heads getting correctly assembled, but by the end of the exercise, teams were assembling all potato heads with less than two errors.

Jefferson College's longstanding Nursing program has undergone a revitalization through the creation of a NEST (Nursing Education Simulation

Technology) lab, revamped curriculum, an emphasis on skills development and academic needs of students, and the leadership of highly qualified faculty who are working together to bring a wide range of professional experiences to the classroom.

The program focuses on relevant, industry-focused curriculum; tremendous clinical practicum experiences at sites throughout the region; state-of-the-art patient simulation labs; and individualized academic and personal support services. The program also offers flexible advancement from PN to RN to BSN thanks to Jefferson College's educational partnership with Central Methodist University.



Each Outstanding Achievement Award recipient was presented a plaque and a \$250 stipend. The recipients' names will also be displayed on the Foundation Honor Roll in the Administration Building lobby on the Hillsboro campus.

Faculty nominees must demonstrate intellectual vigor and communication skills in the interpretation and presentation of subject matter; promote positive morale through a congenial, supportive attitude toward students and peers; exhibit initiative, innovation and creativity resulting in improved learning and comprehension; demonstrate concern for and sensitivity to the needs of students and others; leave a favorable and lasting influence on students; put forth an effort to improve self as well as to develop and recognize others; and enhance the image of the department and/or college.

Nominees for staff recognition must demonstrate excellence in overall work performance; promote positive morale through a congenial, supportive attitude and by providing service to others; put forth an effort to improve self as well as to develop and recognize others; exhibit initiative, innovation and creativity resulting in improved operating efficiency of a work unit or the college as a whole; enhance the image of the department and/or college; and be a full-time employee of the college for at least five years.

Since 1991, the Jefferson College Foundation has actively encouraged private contributions to assist the college in areas such as capital projects, program development, and providing financial support to students that traditional funding alone often does not support.

During the 2016-17 fiscal year, the Foundation raised \$445,704. Of that amount, \$85,000 was awarded in scholarships to 82 students, \$4,280 was earmarked for emergency loans or grants, and \$2,225 was provided to help students purchase textbooks they needed to succeed. Without help from the Foundation, many of these students wouldn't be able to pursue their educational goals.
