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PTA245 Pathological Implications in Rehabilitation

Description: This course presents information on the most common pathologies of each of the body's organ systems to include signs and symptoms of the disease, how the pathology is diagnosed and medically treated, how the disease normally progresses, and possible complications. Complex patients with multiple pathologies, common clinical emergencies, and precautions and modifications for physical therapy interventions, and handling common emergency situations in the clinic are discussed.
