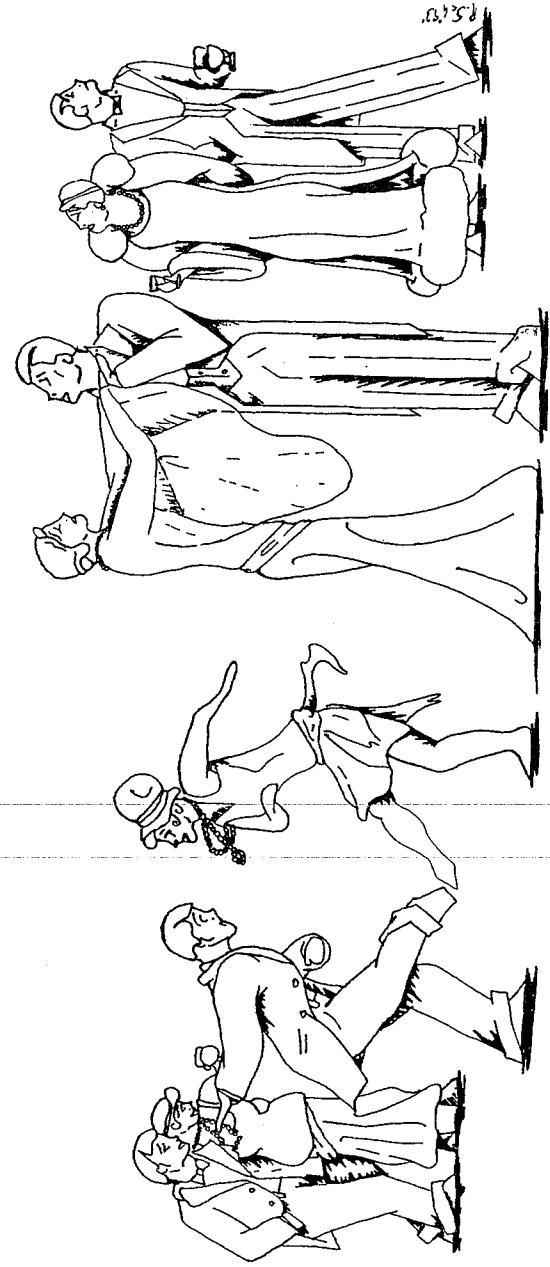

The action of the play takes place in the hall of the Blissesses' house at Cookham in June.

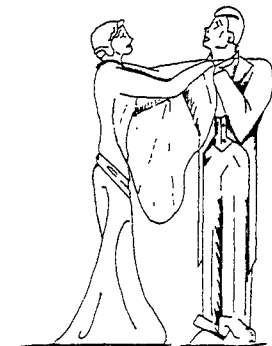

Cast Biographies

Troy Andrew: Troy is a graduate of Southwest Missouri State University, from which he attained a B.S.E. with a minor in musical theater dance.
