



ARTICULATION MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

1. PURPOSE

The purpose of this Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between **Columbia Southern University (CSU)** and **Jefferson College** is to establish criteria for a transfer credit and program acceptance agreement.

2. FACILITATE COOPERATION

A. CSU and Jefferson College mutually agree to:

1. Identify a point of contact, respectively, to coordinate the review of coursework and determine transfer of credit to CSU programs.
2. Provide a depiction of respective logos and approved text and authorize the other Party to use such logos and text to promote the programs, provided the respective materials are approved in writing by the Parties. Use of materials, approved or otherwise, outside of the agreement is expressly prohibited without prior authorization and written consent.
3. Inform students that tuition, fees, and other costs shall be received directly from the student. **Jefferson College** is not responsible to pay any student tuition, fees, or other costs.

B. CSU shall:

1. Provide **Jefferson College** students and graduates with **CSU** degree program requirements. Program information is located publicly on the **CSU** website and in the **CSU** university catalog. All **CSU** associate and bachelor's degree courses and programs, including those newly developed in the future, are eligible for credit consideration and review by the appropriate **CSU** authority.

2. Provide **Jefferson College** students and graduates with **CSU**'s admission requirements, and institutional policies and procedures. **Jefferson College** students and graduates are required to follow all **CSU** requirements, policies, and procedures for all degree programs.
3. Provide **Jefferson College** students, faculty, staff, and their families with a **Learning Partnership** discount of 10% for academic courses taken at **CSU**.
4. Deploy a Partner-specific landing page with instructions and transfer credit requirements for prospective students.
5. Reserve the right to modify degree program requirements at any time to preserve the University's best practices and program integrity. **CSU** policies, regulations, procedures and curricula are subject to change without prior notice, if necessary, to keep the University in compliance with accrediting and regulatory guidelines.
6. **Jefferson College** and **CSU** agree to share relevant data, as allowed under the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA), to assess and evaluate student success and identify opportunities to improve student programs and services. Information beyond the directory information should be a discussion between the student and **Jefferson College**.

C. **Jefferson College** shall:

1. Notify **CSU** of any course changes that affect this MOU, including courses that are added, dropped, or modified.
2. Inform **Jefferson College** graduates of the terms of this MOU. This MOU and transfer credit information herein relates to **Jefferson College** graduates completing all standards and criteria for an Associate of Arts, Associate of Arts in Teaching, Associate of Fine Arts, Associate of Science, and Associate of Applied Science degree plan from **Jefferson College**. In addition, **Jefferson College** graduates must meet all requirements pertaining to application for admission and payment of tuition and fees to be eligible for admission to **CSU**. **Jefferson College** graduates entering **CSU** programs will abide by the policies and procedures as they apply to all **CSU** students.
3. Provide the **CSU** partner-specific URL.

3. APPLICABILITY, REVIEW, AND EFFECTIVE DATE

- A. **Applicability:** This **MOU** applies to both parties and to any and all of their respective employees, agents, and consultants involved in course design, maintenance, documentation, and delivery, as well as evaluation of course materials and students. Nothing in this **MOU** shall take precedence or negate in any way the policy, directives, and procedures of the respective signatory. Conflicts between this document and any other guidance shall be referred to the respective point of contact for resolution. If a satisfactory resolution cannot be achieved at this

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level, the responsible points of contact shall refer the matter to the signatories of this **MOU** through their respective channels.

- B. When requested by either party, the parties will convene to consider whether this **MOU** remains beneficial to both parties and will consider all potential modifications or updates to optimize the **MOU**.
- C. This **MOU** is effective upon acceptance of both parties as indicated by the authorized signatures below.

4. VOLUNTARY CHARACTER OF RELATIONSHIP

Each Party:

- A. Acknowledges their voluntary participation in this cooperative arrangement and in doing so imposes no obligation to expend money or other resources beyond the simple administrative actions outlined in this **MOU**.
- B. Agrees to bear its own cost of participation in this **MOU**. All costs incurred under this **MOU** are gratuitously rendered and will not result in a charge or obligation to the other Party.
- C. Agrees the relationship of the Parties under this **MOU** and any resulting written agreements shall be that of independent contractors, and neither Party shall be deemed, nor shall hold itself out as being, a partner, broker, employee, servant, or agent of the other Party.
- D. Agrees neither Party shall be liable for the acts, statements, or representations of the other which in any way relate to this **MOU**.

5. TERMINATION

Either Party, without cause, may terminate this **MOU** with a 90-day written notice to the other Party.

- A. Upon notice of termination, both Parties will update their respective websites within 30 calendar days of the termination date.
- B. **CSU** agrees to accept validated transfer credits presented to **CSU** by a student through the close of business on the termination date.
- C. Notwithstanding the foregoing, either Party may immediately terminate this agreement in the event that participation under the agreement gives rise to a violation of any requirement of federal or state law, regulation, or the requirements of any accrediting agency having jurisdiction.

- JC general education courses can potentially transfer toward CSU general education requirements, as outlined in this agreement, or Open Electives. JC courses that do not fit CSU’s general education categories will be reviewed for possible Open Electives credit.
- Direct transfer credit for a Major Requirements or General Education course requires the transfer course to be a minimum of 3 semester hours. Transfer credit is only transferred in multiples of 3 semester hours to Major Requirements or General Education categories.
- Any JC course worth 4 or more semester hours but only given 3 semester hours for chart purposes would be reviewed for the full credit designated by JC, subject to program director approval.
- Credit awarded is subject to degree requirements at the time of enrollment and current transfer credit policy, which are subject to change.
- CSU is in the process of converting to new course numbers and anticipates completion by the end of 2023.
- Actual number of transfer credit hours awarded (and therefore the number of hours to be completed at CSU) will be based on actual courses completed successfully at JC for which there exists a CSU equivalent and could be more or less than the number of transfer credits in the example above. Please note, CSU accepts a maximum of 90 semester hours of transfer credit in the bachelor’s degree program.

- JC general education courses can potentially transfer toward CSU general education requirements, as outlined in this agreement, or Open Electives. JC courses that do not fit CSU's general education categories will be reviewed for possible Open Electives credit.

- Direct transfer credit for a Major Requirements or General Education course requires the transfer course to be a minimum of 3 semester hours. Transfer credit is only transferred in multiples of 3 semester hours to Major Requirements or General Education categories.
- Any JC course worth 4 or more semester hours but only given 3 semester hours for chart purposes would be reviewed for the full credit designated by JC, subject to program director approval.
- Credit awarded is subject to degree requirements at the time of enrollment and current transfer credit policy, which are subject to change.
- CSU is in the process of converting to new course numbers and anticipates completion by the end of 2023.
- Actual number of transfer credit hours awarded (and therefore the number of hours to be completed at CSU) will be based on actual courses completed successfully at JC for which there exists a CSU equivalent and could be more or less than the number of transfer credits in the example above. Please note, CSU accepts a maximum of 90 semester hours of transfer credit in the bachelor's degree program.
