

## **DEGREES/CERTIFICATES OFFERED**

The College offers five associate degrees and several career and technical education certificates.

Associate of Arts (AA) degree – A program of general studies designed for transfer to another college or university as part of a bachelor's degree. Save time and money by starting at Jefferson College!

Associate of Arts in Teaching (AAT) degree - Designed for education majors who plan to transfer to another college or university as part of a bachelor's degree. Those who want to become certified to teach Early Childhood, Elementary, Middle School, or Secondary Education should follow this course of study.

Associate of Science (AS) degree - Designed for engineering, engineering technology, and biological science students to transfer to a university as part of a bachelor's degree.

Associate of Fine Arts (AFA) degree - Designed for transfer to another college or university as part of a bachelor's degree in art or music.

Associate of Applied Science (AAS) degree - Designed for entry-level employment through practical and theoretical courses. Choose from over 20 outstanding programs!

A student may qualify for one AA, AAT, AFA or AS degree. The AAS degree and career and technical education certificates are not limited by prior graduation.
