

## Preparing for Reaccreditation in 2019: College Receives Praise from Higher Learning Commission for Quality Initiative

As we continue to prepare for the upcoming reaccreditation visit by the Higher Learning Commission March 11-12, I am pleased to share some excellent feedback we have received regarding our quality initiative.

As part of the HLC Open Pathway model for reaffirmation of accreditation, a Quality Initiative is required during years 5-9 of the 10-year cycle. It is an institution-wide, quality improvement project. Jefferson College's Quality Initiative began in 2013 and focused on implementing the attendance and participation tracking system and using data from this system to improve student retention rates. Jefferson College submitted its [Quality Initiative](#) final report this past August.

The review of the College's Quality Initiative by the HLC focuses on the seriousness of the undertaking, the scope and impact of the initiative, commitment to and engagement in the initiative, adequate resource provision, and genuine effort on the part of the institution. The HLC accepted Jefferson's Quality Initiative and responded with overwhelming praise on our efforts.

The College received [this report from the HLC](#), noting that "Jefferson College's focus on building infrastructure (e.g. attendance/participation tracking system, card readers for large lecture halls) facilitated greater use of student data for continuous quality improvement and deep engagement of faculty in student retention...Equally impressive is the use of data to improve student policies and practices beyond attendance/participation...With clearly defined and articulated phases and goals, Jefferson has a clear focus on measuring and documenting outcomes and progress to plan...**Jefferson is to be commended for taking an end-in-mind student success approach** to challenges that often are left at the mere compliance level. Instead, **by engaging a wide variety of stakeholders through a standing committee structure, the College used the opportunity to leverage a positive and lasting culture shift.**"

This exceptional feedback is validation that we are on the right course! Thank you to the many individuals who led or otherwise participated in our Quality Initiative. This effort has not only positioned Jefferson College well as we move into the final stages before our onsite HLC visit, but it has made our institution more effective in serving students.

Without question, the feedback we have received is a significant institutional indicator of success. Great job!

## 2018 Bi-Level Nursing Program PN Graduates - Pinning Ceremony Celebrates Excellence



After a successfully finishing a comprehensive and challenging curriculum, a group of 20 students from across the area recently were pinned in a ceremony marking their completion of the level I/Practical Nursing portion of the Jefferson College bi-level Nursing program.

In Jefferson College's bi-level program, those who complete one year of training receive a career education certificate and may become a licensed practical nurse after successfully completing the state board examination. Students who complete the second year of the program receive an Associate of Applied Science degree and are eligible to take the state licensing exam for registered nurses.

# PTK Honor Society Chapter Hosts Save A Life Safe Driving Awareness Program

In an effort to emphasize the need for safe driving and awareness at all times, the Jefferson College Xi Zeta chapter of Phi Theta Kappa honor society recently hosted a Save A Life Tour and safe driving pledge event on the Hillsboro campus.

The public service event, which garnered St. Louis regional media coverage by KSDK News Channel 5, was part of an annual campus service project by the honor society chapter.

Participants learned about distracted decisions, impaired responsibility, drugged choices, and seatbelt accountability through a live presentation and a unique driving simulator. Afterwards, attendees were given the opportunity to sign a pledge through the KMA Foundation to become a safe driver.

The Save A Life Tour travels locally, nationally and internationally, and is considered to be the nation's most advanced and high-impact safe driving awareness program. Beginning with a thought provoking video, the live program includes presentations of personal stories including the loss of loved ones. The event brings mass crowd participation to the driver's seat of highly advanced impaired and distracted driving simulators. The multi-million dollar Distracted and Impaired Simulators are the only ones in the nation that give participants a completely realistic, sober perspective on the effects of driving while impaired or distracted.

The KMA Foundation [www.kmafoundation.org](http://www.kmafoundation.org), named after Kaela Marie Archambault who died in an automobile fatality in Jefferson County in 2010, is dedicated to honoring and keeping the memories of loved ones who have lost their lives in traffic accidents alive in our hearts and in the hearts of communities. Through advocacy efforts, scholarships, community events and programs, the Foundation advocates for safer roads and highways. The KMA Foundation also inspires others to become safer drivers.

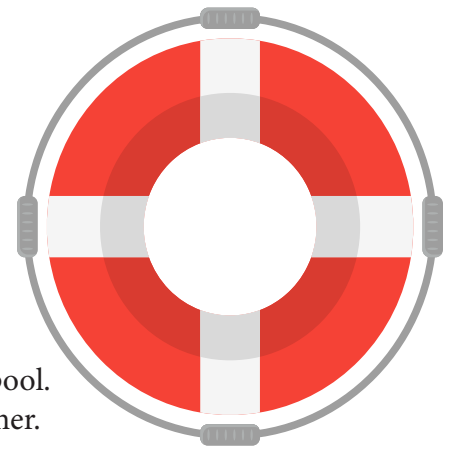
