
2019-20 Performing Arts Series (PACE) Brings Culture and Entertainment to Region

In connection with the College's mission to provide learning opportunities for area residents of all ages, the schedule of events has been announced for the annual Performing Arts and Cultural Enrichment (PACE) series.

The 2019-20 PACE season features 28 events spanning a wide range of fine arts entertainment genres. It includes guest artists from across the country in the areas of theatre, art, literature, and music, in addition to performances by Jefferson College student/community groups.

Guest artists vary from a Pulitzer Prize-winning author to nationally known musicians and highly accomplished local professionals. This year's music performances feature an eclectic mix including jazz, blues, folk music, Dixieland, Argentinian tango, and chamber music. In theatre, there is quirky humor, a charming children's play, drama, suspense, and mystery. The annual atrt exhibits feature both the work of Jefferson College students in addition to a special exhibit of exceptional high school works.



PACE season passes are available for \$25 per person general admission and \$15 for students and senior citizens. Passes can be purchased (cash, check or credit card) at the cashier's window in the Student Center on the Hillsboro campus Monday-Thursday 7:30 a.m.-6 p.m. or Friday 7:30 a.m.-4 p.m. Those who purchase a season pass will save money compared to single event admission for the entire series. 
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All individual advance ticket purchases must be done in person at the Cashier's Window located in the Student Center, Hillsboro Campus:

Acclaimed vocalist Elizabeth Moen will kick off the PACE Series for 2019-20 with a concert on Tuesday, August 27, at 7 p.m. in the Fine Arts Theatre on the Hillsboro campus.

Moen hails from Vinton, Iowa, where she first taught herself how to play guitar. But it was thanks to the writing community in Iowa City that she was inspired to write her own songs, ultimately quitting her three jobs in 2015 to become a full time musician. Since then, she has taken the Midwest by storm. With the release of her first vinyl LP in 2017, she has toured the Midwest, Europe, and the West Coast as a solo performer and with her full band. Moen's song "Mars" is currently featured in the Netflix original movie Candy Jar, starring Christina Hendricks, Uzo Aduba, and Helen Hunt.

Fall classes begin the week of August 19. Among the available class formats and options are online, day, evening, hybrid (on site/online), 8, and 16-week formats. Dean's List Announced for Spring 2019

Jefferson College Vice President of Student Services, Dr. Kimberly Harvey, has announced the Dean's List for the Spring 2019 semester, containing the names of 653 students who earned the academic recognition.

To qualify for the Dean's List honor, full-time students must achieve a grade point average of 3.25 or higher (on a 4.0 scale) in at least 12 graded credit hours taken that semester. Part-time students who accumulate 12 or more graded credit hours with a 3.25 grade point average also qualify and must contact the Vice President of Student Services Office within 10 days of grade reporting to be included.

Aiming for the Stars: Jefferson College Observatory to Become a Reality Through Partnership with St. Louis Astronomical Society

Jefferson College and the St. Louis Astronomical Society (SLAS) are working together to develop an astronomical observatory in phases near the Softball Field on the College's Hillsboro campus.

The observatory's purpose is to engage the community to learn more about the science of astronomy and physics. It will become the first public observatory in Jefferson County affiliated with SLAS. Regular stargazing and solar viewing events for the public will be hosted by Jefferson College and SLAS. A variety of events such as eclipses, transits, comets, and meteor showers are expected to draw large audiences. Educators and students of K-12 schools will be encouraged to make use of the observatory for educational projects.



When complete, the observatory site will feature several buildings equipped with ready-to-use telescopes of sufficient aperture (light gathering ability) to allow for college level research and community educational events. A patio viewing area will be available to amateur astronomers and enthusiasts to explore the night sky and our closest star, the Sun.

Members of the St. Louis Astronomical Society will also use the observatory to host public and private events.

Observatory Facilities

The observatory will be developed in phases over several years as funding is secured.

Long-term plans include three observatory buildings to house permanently mounted telescopes and provide storage for portable astronomy equipment accessories, a patio viewing area with electrical hookups for the public and amateur astronomers to bring their own telescopes, and a wall to protect the viewing area from vehicle headlights of those that are visiting the site. The location makes use of paved parking that already exists next to the site. Restrooms are available within a short walking distance.



When complete, the observatory facility will include:

- An "observatory dome" owned by SLAS that will house a permanently mounted 16-inch telescope with a motorized dome.
- A patio with telescope "pads" for the public and amateur astronomers to use their personal equipment. Each pad will have electrical hookup to facilitate equipment set up.
- 3 A wall designed to shield vehicle headlights.
- Additional buildings large enough to house telescopes ranging up to 30" in aperture and host 10-15 visitors at a time, while providing storage for portable astronomy equipment accessories. Telescopes will be permanently mounted in each building, with motorized, "roll-off" roofs to simplify operation and reduce wear/tear of equipment.

Observatory Location



The observatory will be located north of the Hillsboro campus (on Farm Road) near the Softball Field and share a paved parking lot, making the site especially attractive to astronomers from across the region due to its location outside the immediate St. Louis area and the associated light band.

The convenient location of the observatory site at Jefferson College is expected to draw visitors from Jefferson County and the surrounding region. Visitors from the St. Louis metropolitan area will find the observatory just a 30-minute drive on southbound Highway 21 from the intersection of Interstate 270 in St. Louis County.

Funding - Timing - Construction Phasing




The College and the St. Louis Astronomical Society will partner to raise funds to develop the site. Observatory project funds will be raised from public donations, grants, and corporate sponsors. Project rollout will be determined by available funding for each phase. Each phase of the project will be functional on its own, making the observatory useful from the outset. Estimated costs of each phase will not be available until architectural drawings are complete.



Development of the observatory is planned to proceed in the order shown on the architectural rendering: Structure #1 (observatory dome), followed by structure #2 (viewing patio), followed by structure #3 (headlight shield wall), followed by structures #4 and #5 (buildings with retractable roofs).

An initial amount of \$38,000 in Capital Project Funds has been approved by the College and will be allocated according to the following priority order illustrated on the site plan:

- Construct platform for the SLAS-owned dome and telescope
- 2 If funding remains, construct concrete patio for individual telescope set up/viewing
- 3 If funding remains, construct headlight shield wall



The St. Louis Astronomical Society has purchased adequate equipment and accessories to be placed in the observatory buildings being developed.
