## Health Information Technology Program Fully Online – Spring 2020 Start



For anyone who is interested in a career within the business side of the healthcare field, the Jefferson College Health Information Technology (HIT) program is moving to a fully online format beginning in the Spring of 2020.

HIT is an Associate of Applied Science degree program that is flexible for those who work and can be taken either full-time or part-time. It prepares students to further their career as a manager of health information systems in a broad range of healthcare settings, and gives a career option to those who are not comfortable with blood, needles, or bodily fluids.

Courses are taught by experienced professionals in the industry.

Medical records and health information technicians assemble patients' health information including medical history, symptoms, examination results, diagnostic tests, treatment methods, and all other healthcare provider services. Technicians organize and manage health information data by ensuring its quality, accuracy, accessibility, and security. They regularly communicate with physicians and other healthcare professionals to clarify diagnoses or to obtain additional information. The increasing use of electronic health records (EHR) will continue to broaden and alter the job responsibilities of health information technicians. Technicians can specialize in many aspects of health information including medical coding, tumor registry, record analysis, and release of information.

### Skills/Background Needed



Typical coursework in health information technology includes medical terminology, anatomy and physiology, health data requirements and standards, clinical classification and coding systems, data analysis, healthcare reimbursement methods, database security and management, and quality improvement methods. Applicants can improve their chances of admission by taking biology, math, chemistry, health, and computer science courses in high school.




According to the federal Bureau of Labor Statistics, employment of medical records and health information technicians is expected to increase by 20 percent, much faster than the average for all occupations through 2026. In addition, with the increasing use of electronic health records, more technicians are needed to complete the new responsibilities associated with electronic data management.

Health Information Technology (HIT) is an Associate of Applied Science degree program that prepares you for a career as a manager of health information systems in a broad range of healthcare settings, and gives a career option to anyone who is not comfortable with blood, needles, or bodily fluids.

Health information technicians help organizations to maintain and organize Electronic Healthcare Records (EHRs) and patient information using computer software and health information systems. They handle confidential patient information and work in a variety of settings including hospitals, medical facilities, insurance companies, government agencies, and other environments.

Job duties may include organizing, analyzing, and evaluating health records; coding medical records for insurance reimbursement; maintaining and using health indexes and registers for continuing education, research, and healthcare planning; inputting and retrieving computerized health data; and controlling the usage and release of health information.

## Computer Integrated Manufacturing Program Receives \$12,000 Grant for Scholarships

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The Jefferson College Computer Integrated Manufacturing (CIM) program has received a \$12,000 grant from the Gene Haas Foundation. Funds will be available for a scholarship available to all students in the CIM program to cover the cost of certification exams provided by the National Institute of Metalworking Skills (NIMS).

Currently there is a high demand for manufacturing technicians and skilled tradespeople in Jefferson County and the surrounding region. In many instances, jobs are so plentiful that there are not enough workers to fill needed positions.

The presentation occurred during Manufacturing Day at Jefferson College. This is the third time that the Gene Haas Foundation has made a scholarship contribution to the College.

Students in the CIM program learn computer integration in industrial manufacturing, which is the key to providing high precision and intricate machined metal parts into the world's growing demand for extremely technical design using computer aided drafting and computer aided manufacturing (CAD/CAM). Jefferson College CIM graduates are prepared to enter careers as CNC Operators, CNC Programmers, CNC Set-up, CNC Machinists, Manufacturing Technicians, and Research and Development Technicians.

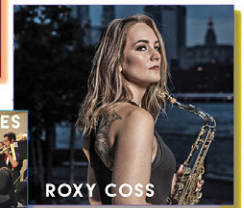

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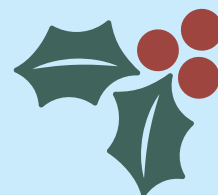
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## 7th Annual Leader Dinner a Holiday Tradition – Tickets On Sale Now

Proceeds from the dinner benefit students in the Jefferson College Culinary Arts program.

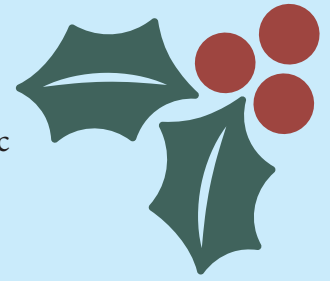
