

College to Host Manufacturing Day Oct. 4 – Connecting Education, Jobs, and Economic Development

In an effort to provide job-related resources and highlight the importance of manufacturing careers as an economic development and educational opportunity in our region, Jefferson College will host the fourth annual Manufacturing Day on Friday, October 4, from 9 a.m.-2 p.m. in the Field House on the Hillsboro campus.

Currently there is a high demand for manufacturing technicians and skilled tradespeople in Jefferson County and the surrounding region. In many instances, jobs are so plentiful that there are not enough workers to fill needed positions.

The event is part of an ongoing emphasis to change people's perceptions about today's manufacturing environment and draw

attention to the outstanding opportunities that a career in manufacturing can provide.



The day will feature employer information, demonstrations such as robotics and 3D printing, employer panels, and tours of manufacturing companies in Jefferson County, in order to promote employment opportunities and products made in Jefferson County. Faculty and staff members from many of the College's Career and Technical Education programs will also showcase curriculum that prepares students for high-wage careers in advanced manufacturing.

German Student Exchange Visit Packed with Multitude of Learning Experiences

Jefferson College's international educational exchange program, organized by the Global Education Subcommittee, recently hosted the second year of students and instructors from Darmstadt, Germany, who were on campus for a weeklong visit as part of the extraordinary learning experience.



The visiting students participated in several of the College's academic programs, viewed demonstrations and instructional technology, toured local factories/employers, and gave presentations about aspects of their home country, while simultaneously learning about life in the United States.



Each member of the German delegation stayed with a Jefferson College faculty/staff host family as a way to experience the culture, food, and traditions of the St. Louis region. The group also participated in a luncheon hosted by the St. Louis German Society, and experienced an American BBQ on campus.

One of the many aspects of the visit was a student symposium, facilitated by Communication and Theatre Associate Professor Lisa Pavia-Higel of the Global Education Subcommittee, highlighting aspects of German culture, industry, and life. Audience members were given the opportunity to ask questions about Germany and the topics presented.

During several of the on-campus events, attendees <u>viewed a video highlighting Jefferson College students</u> who travelled to Germany this past summer.

"Career Expo" Helps Students Explore Career Choices

A group of over 400 ninth and tenth grade students from six area school districts recently attended the annual Jefferson College "Career Expo" to learn about future careers, occupations, and technical programs. The event was hosted by the College's Employment Services Office and the Area Technical School.

"Career Expo" representatives from 40 career fields presented hands-on demonstrations and answered questions about career opportunities, employment possibilities, and future job trends.

All six of the Missouri Connections career pathways were represented: Arts and Communication, Business Management and Technology, Health Services, Human Services, Industrial and Engineering, and Natural Resources and Agriculture.

Participating high schools included Festus, Grandview, Hillsboro, Jefferson R-7, Herculaneum, and Seckman.



"The goal of the Career Expo to expose students to a wide variety of career fields," said Employment Specialist Lora Warner. "Students who attend can learn about career fields prior to making decisions about college or work. We hope that they will learn about career options that they did not know about and gain a better understanding of those they did."

In connection with the partnership between Jefferson College and the St. Louis Astronomical Society (SLAS) to develop an astronomical observatory in phases on the Hillsboro campus, the College will host a free "Star Party" observation night on Sunday, October 6, from 7-10 p.m. for those who want to learn more about astronomy.

The public is invited to bring their own astronomy equipment or use telescopes provided by the College, SLAS, and amateur astronomers.

Observatory Location

From St. Louis, travel South on Highway 21 to the Jefferson College/Hayden Road exit. Turn right onto Hayden Road and then left onto Jefferson College Drive. Farm Road will be approximately one-quarter mile on the right.

The observatory's purpose is to engage the community to learn more about the science of astronomy and physics. It will become the first public observatory in Jefferson County affiliated with SLAS. Regular stargazing and solar viewing events for the public will be hosted by Jefferson College and SLAS. A variety of events such as eclipses, transits, comets, and meteor showers are expected to draw large audiences. Educators and students of K-12 schools will be encouraged to make use of the observatory for educational projects.

The observatory will be developed in phases over several years as funding is secured. Project funds will be raised from public donations, grants, and corporate sponsors. Project rollout will be determined by available funding for each phase.


