#JeffersonCollegeCounts – 2020 Census Vital to Educational Funding



Did you know that the upcoming 2020 census is our chance to make sure the hard-earned tax dollars we send to Washington, D.C. make their way back to Missouri? For every adult and every child that is not counted in the census, our state will lose about \$1,300 in federal dollars every year. When every Missourian is counted, we get more money for roads and bridges, hospitals, and schools.

Low participation in the 2020 census could have substantial negative consequences for our state. As a result of the 2010 census, Missouri lost a congressional seat and hundreds of millions of dollars in federal funding.

In addition to focusing on students, the Jefferson College Library is serving as a resource for anyone in our community who needs help to complete the census. Library staff have also completed an online <u>census</u> <u>libguide</u> filled with numerous resources.

Our Community Is Counting On You...

- ↑ The U.S. Constitution mandates that everyone in the country be counted every 10 years. The first census was in 1790. Completing the census is a way to participate in our democracy and say "I COUNT!"
- ★ In mid-March, the U.S. Census Bureau will mail instructions to every household April 1 is National Census Day. In May, the Census Bureau will begin following up in person with households that have not yet responded.
- ↑ The census asks nine simple questions about the people living in your household. This includes name, age, race, sex, and if you own or rent your home.
- This census marks the first time you will be invited to respond online—even on your mobile device. The online form is available in many different languages. You may also complete by phone or by mail.



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
- Your responses to the 2020 Census are safe, secure, and protected by federal law. Your answers can only be used to produce statistics—they cannot be used against you in any way. By law, all responses to U.S. Census Bureau household and business surveys are kept completely confidential.
- ♦ College students who live away from home on April 1, 2020 will be counted where they live. Jefferson College is working directly with the U.S. Census Bureau to count students who live on campus.

College President's Coronavirus Update

With coronavirus now detected in our region, I want to assure everyone that we are making emergency instructional/business/continuity response plans to serve students and protect all employees in the event a closure or other operations decision becomes necessary.

Beyond their normal facility cleaning process, our Buildings and Grounds housekeeping staff are performing daily deep cleaning of classrooms and offices and the wiping down of high-touch surfaces like handrails, doorknobs, chairs, etc., with a healthcare grade disinfectant. As a proactive measure over Spring Break, they will employ additional sanitizing measures consistent with CDC recommendations including fogging larger campus gathering spaces, the anticipated installation of 20 respiratory hygiene stations, and the deployment of other cleaning resources.

We are also cautioning students and employees about travel plans during Spring Break and through the end of the academic year.



In an effort to keep our campus community up-to-date, we have created a <u>webpage</u> that lists timely resources and safety updates as they become available.

Lastly, if a member of the Jefferson College community tests positive for coronavirus, we will immediately communicate this and implement measures to reduce further exposure across campus. We will also work directly with any student who tests positive to limit disruption to their academic studies as we work to deliver instruction through alternative platforms as needed.

Everyone Doing Their Part

Working together, we can all do our part to minimize the spread of cold/flu or coronavirus. We need to wash our hands often with soap and water and use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer when a sink isn't available. We should avoid touching our eyes, nose and mouth and cover our coughs and sneezes. Although it may seem strange, also consider waving hello instead of exchanging a handshake.

Thanks for your patience and understanding as we continue to make decisions and develop plans to protect the well-being of all students, faculty/staff and community visitors. Each of us has a key role to play in keeping Jefferson College a healthy place to learn, live and work.

Certified Nurse Assistant (CNA)



The Certified Nurse Assistant (CNA)
Program is designed to teach students
how to perform basic nursing skills for
residents in a long-term care facility under
the supervision of Charge personnel. This
eight-week course meets the requirements
mandated by the Missouri Department of Health
and Senior Services.

Medical Assistant Program (MA)



This hybrid, innovative course prepares students for employment as a Certified Clinical Medical Assistant or a Certified Medical Administrative Assistant. Course consists of 510 hours of online instruction, 40 hours of instructor led Pre-Clinical Academy, and 130 to 180 hours of on-site clinical experience. It is anticipated student will complete training program in 12 months or less.

Certified Medication Technician (CMT)



The Certified Medication Technician program prepares individuals for employment as a CMT in an intermediate or skilled care nursing facility. This program consists of at least 60 classroom hours of instruction and a minimum of 8 hours of clinical practice under the direct supervision of an instructor.

PREREQUISITE: Must be a Certified Nurse's Aide for at least 6 months prior to admission and maintain CNA employment throughout the training.

Pharmacy Technician (with ASHP/ACPE)



This 400 hour online training program instructs students on accurately and efficiently preparing prescription orders, verifying prescription information, entering patient and order information into the pharmacy system, processing and submitting insurance claims, and providing quality customer service to patients and other healthcare providers. Program offers externship

with Walgreens or CVS. Student must have access to computer and internet service.


