

In the summer of 2010, Flores walked 5,328 miles through 10 countries to document how grueling and dangerous the journey



of immigrants to the United States can be and to raise money for an elementary school in Atencingo, Mexico. The story of his journey, accompanied by a series of photographs, capture the essence of the people, communities, and cultures he encountered along the way.

After this life-changing experience, Flores now wants to inspire students to make a positive impact on the world by speaking about the value of servant leadership, philanthropy, and service-learning.

His work has been featured on National Public Radio, MSNBC, and TED. Additionally, Flores has been a keynote speaker for dozens of universities, inspiring audiences through his visual presentations, in which he helps people realize the capacity of their immense human potential given times of extreme adversity.



Jefferson College Observatory Virtual "Aim for the Stars" Event Nov. 8

In connection with the development of an observatory at Jefferson College in partnership with the St. Louis Astronomical Society (SLAS), the College will continue it virtual "Aim for the Stars" educational events for those who want to learn more about astronomy.



The next virtual stargazing program will be held on Sunday, November 8, from 7-8 p.m. and will be live streamed on the Jefferson College Observatory's Facebook page at www.facebook.com/JCObservatory. The free program will include an update on the project (visual tour using architect images), a tour of the night sky using planetarium software, discussion and focus on objects like planets, double stars, clusters, etc., along with information about upcoming astro events, and a question-and-answer session.

The final "Aim for the Stars" virtual program for 2020 will be held on December 6, from 7-8 p.m. Additional viewing/event dates for 20201 will be announced soon.

Under physical distancing guidelines, the College has begun using the undeveloped site on the Hillsboro campus as a teaching and learning opportunity for students enrolled in science and astronomy classes in connection with lab assignments and in-class discussions. When construction is completed, the College will also use the observatory as a learning experience for area K-12 schools.

The observatory's purpose is to engage the community to learn more about the science of astronomy and physics. It will become the first public observatory in Jefferson County affiliated with SLAS. Regular stargazing and solar viewing events for the public will be hosted by Jefferson College and SLAS. A variety of events such as eclipses, transits, comets, and meteor showers are expected to draw large audiences.

The observatory will be developed in phases over several years as funding is secured. Project funds will be raised from public donations, grants, and corporate sponsors. Project rollout will be determined by available funding for each phase.
