

Jefferson College Athletics to Undergo Significant Realignment - Addition of New Teams in 2023



For the first time since the department underwent significant changes with the addition of softball and soccer in 2005, Jefferson College Viking Athletics will undergo an historic realignment of its sports program while adding four new teams, including the return of men's basketball, beginning in the fall of 2023.

"This is an exciting time to be able to expand the rich tradition of Vikings Athletics," said College President Dr. Dena McCaffrey. "The return of men's basketball and the excitement of adding men's and women's cross country and competitive cheer will provide greater opportunities for local student and community involvement underscored by our high standards on and off the field."

The new sports teams will result in the potential of 48 new full-time students.

Recommended by Athletics Director Bob Deutschman and approved by the Jefferson College Board of Trustees, the changes are being made in conjunction with the National Junior College Athletic Association's (NJCAA) requirement that institutions make sport declarations every four years. The College was originally scheduled to declare its divisional commitment in the fall of 2020, but the window was postponed by the NJCAA until October of 2021 due to COVID-19. The new cycle will last from August 1, 2023 through July 31, 2027.

"I am thankful to President McCaffrey and the Board of Trustees for giving the Athletics Department an opportunity to add sports teams and continue the extraordinary tradition of Vikings Athletics," said Deutschman. "I look forward along with our coaches and staff to fielding competitive Viking teams in the NJCAA that embody the longstanding excellence set forth by Jefferson College."

Existing teams that will be realigned are Women's Basketball to Division II and Women's Soccer to Division II. The remaining existing teams (Men's Baseball, Men's Soccer, Women's Softball, and Women's Volleyball) will retain their current NJCAA Division I status.



The connection between Jefferson College and area high schools is a main reason for the identification and expansion of the specific sports approved.

From the time men's basketball was discontinued in the mid-1980s due to budget and housing concerns, there has been a high level of interest in the region for its eventual return. Although the College has not fielded a men's basketball team in that time, it regularly hosts regional high school basketball tournaments featuring players from nearly all of the surrounding schools, providing the College an opportunity to recruit from among the area's best players.

According to institutional success data for all Jefferson College student athletes, the degree completion rate from 2014-2017 was 52.7 percent compared to 30.6 percent for all first-time, full-time, degree-seeking students attending the College. Similarly, the four-year average for completion and transfer was 83.5 percent for student athletes vs 45.4 percent for all first-time, full-time, degree-seeking students.

Jefferson College Partners with MU to Create Transfer Agreement for Veterinary Technicians

To help meet the country's growing demand for veterinary technicians, Jefferson College has partnered with the University of Missouri to create a new transfer agreement for veterinary technology students.

The 'two plus two' agreement allows undergraduate students who earn a two-year associate's degree in veterinary technology at Jefferson College to be automatically admitted as juniors at MU to pursue a newly created bachelor's degree in veterinary technology, which can expand their future employment opportunities and improve their upward mobility.

"Missouri is an agriculture state, and we are proud of the support we have received from state legislators and the Missouri Farm Bureau," said Jefferson College President Dr. Dena McCaffrey. "This is an example of public universities in Missouri supporting education that encourages workforce development opportunities in a growing field."

"Demand for veterinary technicians has grown in recent years, and we are proud to provide new educational opportunities that can keep vet techs engaged and remaining in the profession long term," said Cindy Cravens, director of the Bachelor of Science in Veterinary Technology (BSVT) program at MU. "Our graduates will serve Missourians in both rural and urban parts of the state, helping fill the unmet needs in our state's workforce."

Veterinary technicians assist veterinarians in caring for both domestic companion animals and large farm animals, aiding with surgeries, farm calls, blood tests and routine care.

The agreement between the institutions allows veterinary technology students at Jefferson College who complete the two-year associate degree program this spring to enroll at MU as juniors next fall. In addition to current and incoming Jefferson College students, the agreement also applies to graduates of Jefferson College's two-year Veterinary Technology program dating back to 1978, the year the program earned American Veterinary Medical Association (AVMA) accreditation.

"As our population continues to grow, there has been an increased demand for food production, and therefore a greater need for more veterinarian technicians to help take care of farm animals," said Christopher DeGeare, vice president of instruction at Jefferson College. "Also, there has been an increase in the adoption of companion animals since the COVID-19 pandemic began, resulting in more veterinarian appointments. So, this partnership will help meet the growing demand for veterinarian technicians."

In addition to veterinary technology, MU and Jefferson College have 'two plus two' transfer agreements with more than 15 other degree programs, including biology, business, communications, engineering, economics, education, health sciences, journalism, nursing and political science. As a way to thank area veterans for their service to our country, Jefferson College faculty and students from the Automotive Technology Program will provide complimentary oil changes to vets from 8 a.m.-1 p.m. on Saturday, November 13, at the Automotive Technology lab located at the back of the Career and Technical Education Building on the Hillsboro campus.

Underwritten by Dobbs Tire and Auto Centers, AutoZone, and NAPA, the veteran-focused service project can accommodate up to 60 vehicles. The College's partners will provide oil, filters and supplies, while students and faculty provide the labor as a way to say 'Thank You' to those who have served.

Diesel engines are excluded from this event due to vendor supplies.

Oil changes will be provided by appointment only. Reservations are now being accepted on a first available basis by calling the Automotive Center at (636) 481-3436 between the hours of 11:30 a.m. - 1:30 p.m. Those seeking a free oil change are asked not to call before or after the times listed as students will be in class.

In the spirit of our U.S. military's century-old code of honor, recipients simply need to state that they are a veteran of the armed forces to receive the free services.

Jefferson College believes that it is important to remember those who have served our country and wants to emphasize the importance of support for the military. "This community-centered project is a great way for our students, employees and industry partners to give back to those who have given so much," said Jefferson College President Dr. Dena McCaffrey. "We hope that every veteran in our community will know that Jefferson College is filled with gratitude for their service to our great country."

PACE Series Events in November – Come Join Us!




The Jefferson College Performing Arts and Cultural Enrichment (PACE) Series will feature three events in November ranging from jazz to concert band selections.
