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HVAC and Fire Science Programs to Benefit from \$400,000 State Grant

To further support the impact of career and technical education training programs across the state, Jefferson College was recently selected by the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE) to receive a \$400,000 grant for the Heating, Refrigeration and Air Condition (HVAC) and Area Technical School Fire Science program.



"Career and technical education is critical to our workforce development goals here in the State of Missouri," Governor Parson said. "Every day the necessity for a post-secondary degree, trade, or industry recognized credential is growing for good-paying jobs across the state, and we want to support Missourians as they seek to learn new skills, especially in our career and technical education programs."

The Missouri Area Career Center Opportunity (MACCO) Grant provides funding to enhance the state's CTE capacity by providing more opportunities for CTE students while updating and modernizing career centers' infrastructure and equipment. The funding will enhance the work that these programs do to ensure all Missouri students are prepared for success upon graduation and further contribute to developing Missouri's workforce.

"Jefferson College has a strong commitment to educating the workforce of tomorrow and to providing equal opportunities for all who want to purse their dreams of higher education and well-paying jobs," said President Dr. Dena McCaffrey. "This grant positions the College to remain responsive to employer needs while helping to build a strong regional economy."



Jefferson College will use \$325,000 to create a Fire Science outdoor lab that will enable infrastructure improvements, relocation of a burn building and simulation equipment to a new long-term site with space for future expansion, and installation of water main service, a fire hydrant, and a gravel bed. The remaining \$75,000 will be used to modernize the layout of the Heating, Refrigerating, and Air Conditioning lab in order to increase capacity, improve safety, and enhance simulation experiences for students.

MACCO is funded through the American Rescue Plan Act (APRA) and was included in Governor Parson's Fiscal Year 2023 budget proposal to the General Assembly. MACCO grants local education agencies (LEAs) up to \$400,000 for the following purposes:

- Create new high-demand and emerging programs
- Construct a new area career center building
- Renovate or build an addition to an existing area career center
- Update or expand current CTE programs
- Improve infrastructure for safety and equipment needs
- Upgrade equipment and instructional technology

Grant funds must be used to enhance or extend area career centers' capacities to increase students' knowledge and skills needed to gain employment in current or emerging fields, continue their education, or re-train for new business and industry opportunities. The grant required LEAs to submit an application and match 25 percent of the awarded MACCO funds.

Jefferson College Named Among Best Community Colleges in Missouri

Intelligent.com, a resource for program rankings and higher education planning, has included Jefferson College in its list of the Best Community Colleges in Missouri in 2023. The research identifies top schools in the state based on tuition costs, the number of credits required to graduate, and the online coursework delivery format.



Jefferson College was awarded Best Career Training on the final list. Intelligent.com implemented a unique methodology that ranks each institution on a scale from 0 to 100 across six categories. The scoring system compares each school to tuition costs, admission, retention and graduation rates, faculty, reputation, and the student resources provided for online students. Studies show that obtaining a degree increases income substantially, with graduates earning 84 percent more than those with only high school diplomas or those without a completed GED. The percentage difference in earnings continues to grow with higher learning degrees such as master's, doctoral or professional degrees, with the unemployment rate decreasing to as much as 1.6 percent for those with a doctorate.

The prominent award is given annually to businesses that go above and beyond to show their support for Missouri community colleges and the progression of higher education.

Mercy Hospital Jefferson has collaborated with Jefferson College for years to meet the health care needs of Jefferson County. This relationship has stimulated economic growth, supported students, and enhanced programs. MHJ has been an exceptional clinical partner for our health care programs and has collaborated with the College's Bi-Level Nursing program to create a Dedicated Education Unit that allows highly coordinated patient experiences, incorporating student objectives, debriefing sessions, and hospital and College staff engagement. MHJ collaborates with our Radiologic Technology program to provide clinical opportunities in radiography, CT, and MRI.

An example of their commitment to student education, MHJ employee Bryan Fitzpatrick, PTA, was the 2021 recipient of the Kathy Johnson Excellence in Clinical Teaching Award, which is awarded to an outstanding clinical instructor (PT/PTA) in a seven-state region. This dedication to clinical education reflects the MHJ commitment to the College and students. MHJ representatives are members on advisory committees for the college's health occupation programs. Advisory committee members offer input on curricular updates, industry changes, and future initiatives. An outcome of this demonstrated commitment is the development of the Patient Care Technician (PCT) and the Pathways in Nursing (PIN) programs. MHJ has been intimately involved with the development of core competencies and objectives for high school seniors in the college's PCT program. This program includes spring clinical experiences for students leading to credentialing prior to high school graduation. MHJ has agreed to interview and hire several PCT completers each year. Additionally, this collaborative relationship led to the development of a highly innovative and integrated PIN program to begin in fall 2024 for direct matriculation to the nursing program upon high school graduation from the PCT program.

MCCA is Missouri's largest advocacy group for community colleges. Each year, MCCA honors individuals and businesses who support community colleges in Missouri and provides recognition to those who are selected based on their support, generosity, commitment, and partnerships with community colleges in the state.
