Law Enforcement Academy Graduates Earn 100 Percent POST License Pass Rate

A class of 20 cadets recently graduated from the Jefferson College Law Enforcement Academy in Imperial (039 Night class, 040 Peace Officer Standards and Training POST class, and 041 Day class) helping to fill the ongoing need for qualified officers in Missouri.

The classes all achieved a 100 percent completion pass rate on the POST license exam, continuing the lengthy streak of graduating classes from the Jefferson College Law Enforcement Academy with a 100 percent total pass rate for the POST Class A license.

The JCLEA offers three options for students seeking a Missouri Department of Public Safety POST Class A License and is the only academy in the state that incorporates the curriculum for an Associate of Applied Science Degree in Criminal Justice in two of its three programs as a way to distinguish graduates when they enter the job market. The third program, a POST curriculum only option with day or evening attendance options, offers a Certificate in Criminal Justice and is limited to applicants who already have a two or four-year degree.

In addition to the basic training for students entering the field, the Academy goal includes providing high quality training to law enforcement personnel, to inspire professionalism in all peace officers, and to provide civilian personnel with education and training prior to employment or association with a law enforcement agency.

Jefferson College Observatory "Aim for the Stars" Educational Events Scheduled

In connection with the observatory partnership between Jefferson College and the St. Louis Astronomical Society (SLAS), the College will host several upcoming public "Aim for the Stars" observation nights on the Hillsboro campus for those of all ages who want to learn more about astronomy.

Designed to appeal to community members of all ages, "Aim for the Stars" events provide an overview of plans for the Jefferson College Observatory, help viewers learn how to navigate the night sky, include discussions about items that can be seen at that time, and preview upcoming astronomy events of interest. Each observation event will be held either virtually or in-person at the observatory site depending on weather.

There is no cost to participate in any of the monthly educational programs, led by Jefferson College faculty and SLAS members.

As the first phase of site development is complete, the observatory location is being used by the College as a teaching and learning opportunity for students enrolled in undergraduate science and astronomy classes in connection with lab assignments and in-class discussions.

The observatory is located north of the Hillsboro campus on Farm Road near the Jefferson College Softball Field. It is the first public observatory in Jefferson County affiliated with SLAS. At present, the closest observatory to the site at Jefferson College is located in St. Charles.

All "Aim for the Stars" events will be held beginning at sunset on the first Sunday evening of each month:

September 3

October 1

Special Event – October 14 eclipse - starts at 10:31 a.m. and ends at 1:27 p.m.

November 5

December 2



For programs to occur, skies must be clear or only partly cloudy. Those who attend may bring their own astronomy equipment or use a limited number of telescopes provided. In case of inclement weather or pandemic restrictions, an alternate program will be presented.

Donor Excellence Drives Foundation Success in Year-to-Year Comparison

The Jefferson College Foundation thanks you and Jefferson College for being excellent this past year. The resulting performance of the Foundation is truly a reflection on the quality of programs, extent of the educational opportunities, the strength of all our relationships with students and the community, and the continued pursuit for improvement in all ways.

Donors who give to Jefferson College believe in its mission and vision. The Foundation experienced this belief-in-action through donations. Please continue being excellent for Jefferson College, and thank you again.

The Foundation 2023 fiscal year-end performance and comparison to FY22:

- Total giving: \$1,316,729 -144% increase
- Number of gifts: 2,571 13% increase
- Number of donors: 1,219 29% increase
- New donors: 867 46% increase

This past fiscal year resulted in the largest anonymous donation ever received, \$150,000 to be used for scholarships, and the largest gift to be received of \$500,000 from the estate of David Ault.

FY23 student scholarships: The Foundation provided 143 students with scholarships, emergency book assistance, and grants and loans in the amount of \$148,753 during FY23.

FY23 College funding requests: The Foundation provided \$55,134 to 18 department/program approved funding requests during FY23.
