Ault Family Gift to Jefferson College Foundation Hailed as Single Largest Check in Organization's 32-Year History

The Jefferson College Foundation recently received a gift for \$500,000 from the estate of businessman David Ault, believed to be the single largest check donation the Foundation has ever received since being formed in 1991.

In 2012, Ault, who was then president and owner of Fox Run Golf Club, Fox Run Builders, and Eureka Springs, Inc., committed to a \$500,000 bequest while also gifting a new, fully furnished 4,400 square foot home on his golf course to the Foundation at a total combined value in excess of \$1 million. Through the years, the luxury home and golf course have been used for cultivation, solicitation, and stewardship of donors and prospects.

Ault passed away last year. Subsequently, the estate's trustees, son Gary Ault and daughter-in-law Cathy McCredie, agreed that all terms of the bequest agreement had been fulfilled and recently presented the check to representatives from the College and Jefferson College Foundation.

"I decided that it was the right time to do this, and by spreading the word, perhaps others will follow," said David Ault when he initially made the bequest and home donation over a decade ago. "Jefferson College is a valuable asset to our community and its excellence is demonstrated in the thousands of graduates that live and work throughout the region. I'm proud to support the College and the good things it does to prepare students for a better quality of life."

"We are so pleased that David believed in the work we do and the mission of Jefferson College," said College President Dr. Dena McCaffrey. "We also appreciate his son, Gary, and daughter-in-law, Cathy. This gift, likely the largest one-time gift in the history of the College, will be placed in our unrestricted endowment so that it can grow and allow us to continue to offer quality programs and facilities to our community for years to come."

The culmination of the Ault family's generosity toward the College spans decades and includes contact from past and current Jefferson College Foundation directors, Jefferson College and Foundation presidents, and Foundation board members. Most recently, Executive Director of Development and Strategic Communications Blake Tilley and College President McCaffrey renewed the relationship with Ault in securing the \$500,000 bequest.

"The gift was always revocable, and these types of gifts can be lost when there's no relationship," said Tilley. "In 2021, that relationship was renewed when President McCaffrey and I met with David to confirm his intentions for the College."

The Jefferson College Foundation was established to support the growth and development of the College in ways that are beneficial to students, faculty, staff, and campus facilities. Members of the Foundation board seek to build relationships within our community—connecting a desire for making a positive difference in the lives of others through learning and cultural enrichment to giving opportunities at Jefferson College.

The organization fulfills its mission by actively encouraging private gifts of cash as well as stocks and bonds, real and personal property, insurance, and in-kind donations from individuals, alumni, businesses, associations, and service organizations. Funds are also raised through special events.

Dean's List for Spring Includes More Than 650 Students


