Cash prizes will be awarded for "Best Overall Film" (\$300) and "Runner Up" (\$200). Submitted films will be shown during a public screening on Friday, April 28, at 7 p.m. in the Fine Arts Theatre on the Hillsboro campus. Due to time constraints, the screening may be limited to the 10 best films.

Music Department Student to Debut New Album During Jazz St. Louis Performance




