

Pre-Social Work at Jefferson College

Completing an Associate of Arts in Pre-Social Work at Jefferson College will help you transfer smoothly to a college or university with an accredited Social Work program. While completing your general education classes, as a Pre-Social Work student you will also take degree-specific courses such as

- · Alcohol, Drugs, and Society
- Human Diversity
- Social Problems
- Social Work Lab

As a **Pre-Social Work student**, you will **receive individualized advising** for help with choosing classes, exploring transfer institutions, and investigating career opportunities. Your coursework will include **case studies**, exploration of the **core values and ethical principles** of social work, and a lab class that includes **visits to community agencies**.

HOW DO I BECOME A SOCIAL WORKER?



Social Workers need a Bachelor's degree in Social Work from a program accredited by the Council on Social Work Education (CSWE). Jefferson College has transfer agreements with multiple CSWE-Accredited Schools of Social Work. An Associate of Arts Pre-Social Work gives you the core knowledge, credits, and foundation you need to be accepted and succeed in a Bachelor's program.

After completing a Bachelor's degree, you can begin working in the profession. These four-year degrees open many opportunities within the field. You can also choose to continue your education, often while working as a Social Worker. Graduate degrees in this major include the Master of Social Work (M.S.W.) and the Doctorate in Social Work (D.S.W.) or PhD. An MSW is required if you want to provide therapy.
