President's Report

President's June 2013 Report:

State Budget: As of today, we are still waiting for the Governor to sign the budget bill. As you will see in our budget assumption presentation, we will experience a modest increase in state funding for next year assuming the Governor signs the budget bill as presented.

Summer enrollment: Continuing the trend we are seeing throughout the state, our summer enrollment this year is 2,011 students, taking 10,408 credit hours, an 8.5% decrease from last year. Because of the low number of students typically enrolled for the summer, the percentage decrease seems large—but to put these numbers into perspective, we are still serving over 700 more students than six years ago. The good news is that we are seeing steady enrollment activity for the Fall semester.

Board Forum: The CBHE Forum was informative, focusing on degree attainment, why it is important, and what Missouri is doing. After a welcome and word of encouragement from Governor Nixon (who hosted a reception the night before), the major topics we discussed included:

- Sustaining effective governance and the Board's role in Advocacy and Friend-raising
- The current Missouri financial outlook and the budget projections for 2014-15
- How to meet institutional funding needs now and in the future
- Cost-saving efficiencies and effective strategies
- Removing barriers to degree attainment
- Using technology to transform education, including digital textbooks, etc.
- Bridging the gap between High School and College

Board President Meinberg commented that he was impressed that everyone he came into contact with at the Board Forum knows President Cummiskey and both his peers and legislators look to Dr. Cummiskey for his knowledge; he is very well received and respected.

Sim-man Presentation: Over the past couple of years the college has purchased several training simulator mannequins. Director of Health Technology Programs, Kenny Wilson presented on Adobe Connect technology being used in teaching and presented two videos demonstrating human patient simulation technology being used in our Health Occupations programs.
