
Background

 - Dates: 2005 2010 (Originally a 10 Year Lease)
 - 6,705 Square Foot, Rent \$4,324 per month
 - Programming: General Education and AEL/GED
 - Average enrollment: 346 students
- Leased Jefferson College Northwest Cedar Hill
 - Dates: 2010 2016
 - 45,000 Square Foot, Rent \$4,324 per month
 - Programming: General Education and AEL/GED

 Enrollment: Peaked at 307; drastically declined beginning Fall 2013, 62 enrolled in Fall 2014.






