

Articulation Agreement Between Jefferson College and Webster University



Introduction

This articulation agreement formally recognizes that Webster University, hereinafter referred to as WU, and Jefferson College, hereinafter referred to as Jeff Co, are educational institutions with a shared commitment to increasing opportunities for student access to and success in higher education. By clarifying transfer policies and procedures which assure articulation between programs, the institutions seek to assist students in making a seamless transfer from the associate to the baccalaureate degree.

Statement of Purpose

The purpose of this agreement is to facilitate transfer student matriculation from Jeff Co to WU. The attached transfer equivalency guides will describe how courses will transfer from Jeff Co to WU for the identified programs.

Terms & Conditions of Transfer

Students are required to meet admission requirements of WU. This agreement shall be governed by the academic policies and procedures of WU and Jeff Co. The evaluation and transfer of earned college credit should be in compliance with WU's guidelines and policies.

Responsibilities of Each Institution

Webster University and Jefferson College:

- Maintain the integrity of their separate programs and enter into this agreement as equal partners.
- Put the needs of the students first by serving students in the best manner possible.
- Work to promote academic success of all students by maintaining quality academic programs and institutional accreditation.
- Provide accurate and timely information to students interested in transfer to WU.
- Publicize this transfer agreement through web and printed materials and conversations with students.

Webster University will:

- Provide Jeff Co staff with WU materials regarding programs, admission, and enrollment.
- Conduct information sessions/workshops for Jeff Co students regarding admissions, financial aid, and registration.
- Host Jeff Co students on campus for tours and personalized appointments.

Jefferson College will:

- Provide information about Webster to interested students, faculty, and counselors.
- Provide an opportunity for Webster to present to Jeff Co students at transfer events and/or college fairs.
- Notify WU of significant curricular changes that will impact the transfer guide materials.

Terms of Agreement

This agreement is made and entered into in the academic year [2019-2020] and remains in effect until discontinued with written notice by either or both institutions. The agreement may be amended at any time with the approval of both parties and is subject to regular review to assure currency with the respective degree requirements.

Dual Admission Partnership & Transfer Agreement Between Webster University and Jefferson College

Introduction and Statement of Purpose

Webster University and Jefferson College enter into this dual admission agreement in order to better facilitate the transfer of students between the institutions, to enhance mutual cooperation, and to increase benefits and resources to students who enter under this program. Each institution enters into this agreement as equal partners, and all policies and procedures of the dual admission agreement will maintain the autonomy of each institution. The Dual Admission Program is designed for college students who want to earn an associate degree from Jefferson College and a baccalaureate degree from Webster University.

Provisions

Dual admission to Webster University and Jefferson College is available to students planning to complete the AA in Communications from Jefferson College and a BA in Media Communication from Webster University.

Students who enter Webster University with an associate degree from Jefferson College, have completed a minimum of 60 earned college-level credits, and meet dual admission eligibility requirements, are guaranteed acceptance into Webster with full junior status. Students must meet departmental requirements for acceptance into specific majors.

All students must meet graduation and degree requirements as put forth by each institution. Dual admission students will be required to fulfill all general education requirements through transfer credit or Webster University earned credit. Dual admission does not guarantee graduation within a specified timeframe from either institution.

Student Eligibility

A student must meet the following conditions to be eligible for participation in the dual admission program:

- Apply for dual admission program during the first thirty (30) college-level credit hours at Jefferson College or first two (2) semesters as a Jefferson College student.
- Intend to pursue both an associate degree and baccalaureate degree.
- Meet Webster University and individual departmental minimum GPA and admission requirements.

Students who have previously matriculated at Webster are not eligible to participate in the dual admission program.

Admission Process

Students shall complete an Intent to Participate form, with a copy kept by both institutions. The Intent to Participate form also serves as a release of information, authorizing both institutions to share admissions, financial, academic, and advising information, as appropriate.

Students are to complete separate applications for admission to Webster University and Jefferson College. For admission consideration to Webster University, students should submit all required application materials as outlined at http://www.webster.edu/catalog/current/undergraduate-catalog/admission.html.

Upon completion of their associate degree, students must submit remaining admission materials as defined by their program of study at Webster University.

Maintaining Dual Admission Status

Students participating in the dual admission program shall complete the appropriate associate degree within four years of acceptance into the dual admission program; students not completing this requirement may be eligible to apply for standard transfer to Webster University.

Students participating in the dual admission program shall enroll in Webster University courses within one semester of finishing the associate degree and shall not attend any other institution after completing the associate degree. Students not following this requirement may be eligible to apply for standard transfer to Webster University.

Students must remain within good standing as defined by each institution.

A student may withdraw from the dual admission program at any time prior to earning the associate degree. Student will be expected to notify both Jefferson College and Webster University in writing. The student would be eligible to apply to Webster University as a standard transfer student.

Enrollment and Transfer Credit

The Webster University catalog that is in place at the time a dual admission program student is accepted to Webster will be the catalog that will determine that student's graduation requirements at Webster, provided that constant progress is made toward completion of the degree.

Dual admission students may take coursework at either institution or concurrently, as long as prerequisites have been satisfied.

Webster University and Jefferson College transfer credits will be awarded in accordance with the articulation agreements that exist between the institutions and in line with the transfer policies of each. Students may transfer coursework between institutions in order to satisfy degree requirements at either institution. The home institution will determine transfer eligibility of coursework completed at the other institution.

Communication and Information

Webster University and Jefferson College agree to work together to provide marketing materials for the dual admission program.

Webster University and Jefferson College agree to notify each other regarding any changes in curriculum that will impact this and other institutional agreements.

Webster University and Jefferson College liaisons will share information regarding dual admission program students' declared majors for the purpose of identifying the appropriate academic advising offices on each campus. Jefferson College will send reports each semester confirming dual admission students' academic progress.

Tuition & Fees and Financial Aid

Each student will have a home institution for the purposes of degree completion, financial aid, and veteran benefits. Jefferson College will be designated as the home institution during a student's associate degree program. Webster University will be designated as the home institution during the baccalaureate program.

Tuition will be paid directly to the institution providing the course to the student. This agreement does not alter in any way the commitment of the student to meet all financial obligations to the institution providing the course. All tuition, fees, and other associated costs must be paid by the student directly to the institution providing the courses.

Dual admission program students are eligible for all applicable scholarships available, provided they meet applicant eligibility. Dual admission students are eligible to apply for financial aid, but can only receive add from one institution at a time—from the home institution. Students should complete the FAFSA and any other documents required by the home institution.

Responsibilities of Each Institution

Webster University and Jefferson College will:

- Maintain the integrity of their separate programs and enter into this agreement as equal partners.
- Put the needs of the students first by serving students in the best manner possible.
- Work to promote academic success of all students by maintaining quality academic programs and institutional accreditation.
- Provide accurate and timely information to students interested in transfer to Webster University.
- Publicize this transfer agreement through web and printed materials and conversations with students.
- Designate a liaison who will be responsible for the implementation of this agreement and for overseeing provision of services for students under this agreement.
- Develop process(es) for Intent to Participate including forms and sharing of relevant information.

Webster University will:

- Waive application fee for dual admission students.
- Provide academic advising to dual admission program students.
- Provide dual admission students with a Webster University student ID. A Webster University ID will provide access to University buildings and events including full on-campus access to Webster University's library and University dining services.

Jefferson College will:

- Provide regular reports that include
 - Confirmation students are active DAP participants.
 - Academic progress and confirmation of good standing.
- Send transcripts to Webster University for DAP participants at end of each semester and a final transcript upon degree conferral.
- Provide space to Webster University to facilitate on-site recruitment and advising.

Terms of Agreement

This agreement is made and entered into in the academic year 2019-2020 and remains in effect until discontinued with written notice by either or both institutions. The agreement may be amended at any time with the approval of both parties and is subject to regular review to assure accuracy with the respective admission and degree requirements.

Transfer Guide

Due to changes in curriculum and catalog policy for the 2020-2021 catalog year, the following changes should be noted:

Item #1

Under *Provisions*, in the *Dual Admission Partnership & Transfer Agreement*, should read "Dual admission to Webster University and Jefferson College is available to students planning to complete the AA in Communications from Jefferson College and a BA in Media **Studies** from Webster University."

Item #2

The transfer guide has been updated to reflect the following catalog changes:

- Curriculum change from Media Communications (MEDC) to Media Studies (MDST)
- A minimum of 120 (changed from 128) credit hours required to complete a degree at Webster.
- All transfer credit is capped at 90 (changed from 98) credit hours.

Item #3

There is reference to a dual admission application waiver. It should be noted that Webster University no longer requires an undergraduate application fee.

USING THIS GUIDE:

This guide has been published to assist students in preparing for transfer from Jefferson College with an *Associate of Arts degree in Communications* to Webster University for a *Bachelor of Arts degree in Media Studies*. This should not be used in place of individual academic advising. Students are strongly encouraged to meet with a Webster University transfer admissions counselor early in their academic career to ensure a smooth transfer experience.

ABOUT MEDIA STUDIES MAJOR AT WEBSTER:

The media studies major is a broad communication experience within the School of Communications. In this program, students explore the design, delivery and effects of media messages in a range of communication fields and across multiple communication platforms. Media studies majors approach media from academic and practical standpoints, develop diverse professional portfolios and hone skills integral to a variety of media careers. The media studies degree affords an excellent foundation for pursuing a variety of careers within any organization that uses and values communication.

Required courses for this degree at Webster are available online.

WEBSTER ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

When considering an application, Webster looks for evidence of potential for academic success. A cumulative GPA on all college level coursework of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale is preferred; however, each applicant is given individual consideration. If you have circumstances which might affect your admission this may be discussed confidentially with a member of the admissions staff. The University operates on rolling admission, and application files are reviewed by an admissions counselor as soon as all requested credentials have been received.

Each transfer applicant must submit:

- A completed <u>Application for Admission</u>
 - o If interested, review the information about the Webster Jeffco Media Studies Dual Admission Program.
- An official transcript from Jefferson College, and an official transcript from all other postsecondary institutions
 previously attended. All official transcripts should be sent to:

IMPORTANT TRANSFER NOTES:

- Webster University has a minimum residency requirement that 30 of the student's last 36 credits must be taken at Webster University. All students must have a minimum of 120 credit hours to graduate.
- Courses completed with a grade below a C- do not count toward fulfilling the specific course requirements of the major or general education/Global Citizenship Program.
- Transfer students who have taken introductory coursework in the major should not expect to complete their degree in fewer than four semesters due to sequential nature of courses.

- Most students who major in the School of Communications must complete a portfolio review as a requirement for graduation. This portfolio review or its equivalent is the pre-requisite for an Internship or Senior Overview. While the majority of work students will exhibit for this review should come from assignments in their courses at Webster University, students may also include exceptional work they have completed at other institutions and therefore the departments suggest incoming transfer students save any such work they deem appropriate for the portfolio review. Any questions about the portfolio review process should be directed to their academic advisor.
- Webster University provides full transfer of coursework successfully completed as part of an associate degree awarded by a regionally accredited institution. While students with associate's degrees typically transfer 60-66 credit hours, Webster will transfer in all coursework that is part of the completed associate degree. Transfer of additional lower-division credit beyond the associate's degree is restricted. All transfer credit is capped at 90 credit hours.
- All transfer coursework must be college-level (100-level or above) with a passing grade. A grade of D or higher is
 considered passing, but a D will have severe transfer restrictions. Pass/Fail courses will count for transfer credit
 if the student received a Pass. For repeated courses only the second grade will be counted. Incomplete grades
 are not accepted in transfer. Formal evaluation of transfer credit is conducted by the Office of the Registrar
 upon admission to the University.

MISSOURI REVERSE TRANSFER:

Webster University is participating in the <u>Missouri Reverse Transfer</u> statewide initiative to help more Missourians earn associate degrees. Webster has partnered with each community college in the state to help students apply Webster University credit back to the community college to earn the associate degree, if they transferred prior to earning the degree. Please speak with your transfer admissions counselor or academic advisor for more information.

WEBSTER DEGREE REQUIREMENTS:

Students who complete an Associate of Arts (AA) degree or the CBHE-approved CORE 42 of general education before transferring to Webster University will have satisfied the general education requirements and GLBC 1200 Global Cornerstone Seminar requirement of the GCP.
