I Want to Know: Anonymous Q&A Submission

In advance of the virtual Town Hall on May 1, the following question was asked since my last newsletter:

Q: While searching for directions on Google forms, I happened to notice that it not only shows directions to Jefferson College's various buildings, but it also shows the floorplans for each buildings - right down to where the water fountains are located. Each office, classroom, and lecture hall (and the room numbers) are posted for anyone to see. I'm not sure how up to date it is, but is this something we should consider a security risk?

A: Buildings and Grounds works with Graphics to ensure that floorplans and maps are kept up to date for all three campuses. However, we also understand that the level of detail on the floorplans distributed publicly could create a security concern. As a result, floorplans posted in physical locations throughout the various campus buildings and shared internally will continue to show office locations and details such as the shortest and safest evacuation routes as well as the location of fire pulls and extinguishers, first aid kits, eye wash stations, AED locations, and emergency throw bags. In addition, they will identify areas of refuge and assembly outside the building in the event of an earthquake or a fire. For external information sources, however, we will remove the floorplans from the website and include more general campus maps that do not contain the increased level of detail.
