Vice President of Finance and Administration Daryl Gehbauer and Technology Services Manager John Linhorst shared a presentation at this month's Board of Trustees meeting regarding the approved FY24 Strategic Planning Capital Project list and planned facility renovations and expansion projects that are being financed primarily through a combination of construction bonds, county/state funding, and matching grants.

A partial list of construction-related projects includes the expansion and renovation of Jefferson College Arnold to house all programs currently at Imperial, expansion of Viking Woods, relocation of the Vet Tech program, renovation of the Fine Arts Building north section, renovation of the lower level of the Student Center, and replacement of windows and entrance glass in the Arts and Sciences I building.

College to Host Manufacturing Summit and Visit by GSL CEO Mike Hall

In my role as co-chair of the Greater St. Louis, Inc. (GSL) Investor's Council, I'm excited that the College will be the site for a Manufacturing Summit on March 29 as GSL CEO Jason Hall will be on campus to continue his efforts to provide one voice for the metropolitan region. The summit will give Jefferson County leaders the opportunity to directly share their thoughts and ideas as a voice for our entire community. In addition to the summit, Jason and members of GSL will be touring our Metal Fabrication, Precision Machining, and Welding labs facilities.

Greater St. Louis, Inc. was founded on Jan. 1, 2021, combining the strengths of five legacy organizations — AllianceSTL, Arch to Park, Civic Progress, Downtown STL, Inc., and the St. Louis Regional Chamber — to unify around a common vision and strategy for fostering



represents a 15-county region (six in Missouri and eight in Illinois), including Jefferson County. As an executive board member of the Jefferson County Economic Development Corporation, I am proud to have worked closely with GSL on opportunities like "Project Redbird," the recently announced development for a 1 million square foot James Hardie Building Products production facility in Crystal City.

Bookstore Operations Shifting to Barnes & Noble

Following a recommendation by a task force comprised of faculty, staff, and administrators, the Board of Trustees has approved a contract that will shift operation of the bookstore to Barnes & Noble. As a result, we will move to an equitable access textbook rental fee per-credit-hour platform that allows students to receive all of their textbooks for the semester at \$24 per credit hour. This will save the average student almost \$200 per academic year.

The operations contract is for three years with the ability to renew for an additional three years in one-year increments. The exact date of the transition is yet to be determined, but



will occur prior to the start of the Fall 2023 semester. Additional transition information will be released soon to all students and faculty/staff explaining the new program and its effective date.
