Tiered Tuition for Fall 2024

The new tiered tuition model begins this fall and brings transparency of pricing for students by consolidating tuition and course fees (technology, activity, lab, online, hybrid) into a single tuition rate for courses in three tiers. In addition to easier to understand tuition rates, separate fees will no longer be charged to a student's account, and more costs will be covered by A+ scholarships. Overall, this new model better aligns tuition prices with instructional costs. The textbook fee will remain separate to continue providing students the choice to opt-out.

Groundbreaking Ceremony

This state supported MoExcel project allows us to expand Vet Tech enrollment by 33%. The current enrollment cannot meet the workforce demands. Being one of only five programs in the state, graduates have multiple work opportunities at graduation.

The purchase price of \$86,942.04 from Modern Business Interiors was made through the E&I Cooperative Contract. The existing cafeteria furniture has been in use for more than 25 years.
